How to Donate Surplus Food

WHO CAN BE A FOOD DONOR:

Any business that has excess food that could be going to waste, including grocery stores, restaurants, hospitals, schools, performing arts/sports arenas, farms, farmers' markets, corporate dining facilities, and hotels & convention centers.

HOW IT WORKS:

SSTEP 1: Complete the sign-up form at [Bit.ly/pgcfr_signup](https://bit.ly/pgcfr_signup).

STEP 2: PGCFR staff will contact you to develop a donation plan.

STEP 3: Your donations will be matched with a local nonprofit organization that can best utilize them. Then, a volunteer rescuer will pick up and drop off the surplus food.

WHY DONATE FOOD?

- Save money with donation tax deductions & by reducing your trash removal fees.
- Advance your sustainability goals by reducing food waste in landfills, a large contributor to harmful greenhouse gas emissions.
- Help feed the community while protected from liability by the Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Act, a law that protects good faith donations to non-profit agencies.
